Q. When can I remove a posted safety placard?

A. When hazardous conditions have been corrected and reinspected.

- If you were deemed Restricted due to utilities being inundated by flood:
- **Septic system** L.C. Environmental Health
- Electrical Colorado Electrical Board
- Gas check with service provider
- Furnace, water heater— L.C. building permit
- ➢ If you were deemed Restricted or Unsafe due to Structural Issues - Hire an Engineer, Contractor
- Obtain Building Permit
- Obtain Final Inspection Approvals

Once corrections are verified, you may remove the safety placard. We will update records.

Obtaining Building Permits in the Flood Area

(some steps will not apply in every case)

STEP ONE: Substantial Damage in Floodplain

STEP TWO: Registered Colorado engineer

STEP THREE: County-licensed contractor

STEP FOUR: Owner's Affidavit (in floodplain)

STEP FIVE: Building Permit Fee Reduction

STEP SIX: County Building Permit

STEP SEVEN: Colorado Electrical Permit

STEP EIGHT: Septic repair/replacement permit

STEP NINE: Floodplain Development Permit

STEP TEN: Final inspection approvals

What is an emergency repair permit, and how do I get one?

Do I need to get building permits? Whether a building permit is required for restoration work depends on the scope of the work you're doing.

A building permit IS required if the work involves:

- Structural repairs;
- Repairs to your electrical, mechanical (heating, cooling, HVAC) or plumbing system; or
- Replacement of siding or re-roofs.
 A building permit IS NOT required if the work only involves:
- Replacement of carpet, insulation or similar finish material; or
- Replacing windows of the same size.
